Introduction

Who we are

Founded in 2009, Watoto Wasoka is a youth-led football for development organisation based in the heart of Kampala's biggest slums. We use football as a vehicle for positive social change in the lives of slum children in Uganda. Through structured football programmes, we seek to change lives, one game at a time.

We organise the biggest football events for youth in Uganda and East Africa, if not Africa, with our last Slums Derby attracting more than 1,500 kids in 2019, while the last Christmas Camp was attended by more than 2,500 boys and girls from all over Uganda.

Vision:

Changing lives of slum children in Uganda, one game at a time, through structured and regular football programmes.

Mission:

To create purposeful opportunities for play in a safe environment for slum children in Uganda.

Our objective:

To empower, mobilise and educate slums children through football.

What we do

Working with more than 6,000 children, we organise programmes such as;

Football 4 WASH

1

Football 4 WASH is an educative combination of football and health. The programme involves developing, training and implementing football exercises called "drills," which combine fun, play and health education.

The programme involves trainings, workshops and competitions in schools and communities to raise awareness on key health issues and the practices of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH). Through the programme we bring WASH education to more than 6,000 kids every year in Uganda.

With the support of our collaborators Viva con Agua, Football 4 WASH brings WASH services to a further 1,500 kids through WASH hardware (toilets, water tanks and towers etc) in the best performing schools in the programme.

This promotes hygienic behaviour and further reduces the prevalence of WASH related diseases and infections in the children.

Primary Schools League



Played on the basis of the UEFA Champions League format, the league brings football and scholarships to hundreds of slum kids since 2016. The league was created to bring more educational opportunities for slum kids through sports scholarships and bursaries in primary schools around Uganda. Since 2017, we also have the Girls' Primary schools Championship.

The schools in close vicinity are seeded into groups, where they compete against each other on a home and away basis starting out in March. The best teams from each group then qualify for the knock out rounds where they meet schools from other regions, and compete till the final which is a one – legged game at a neutral ground in August.

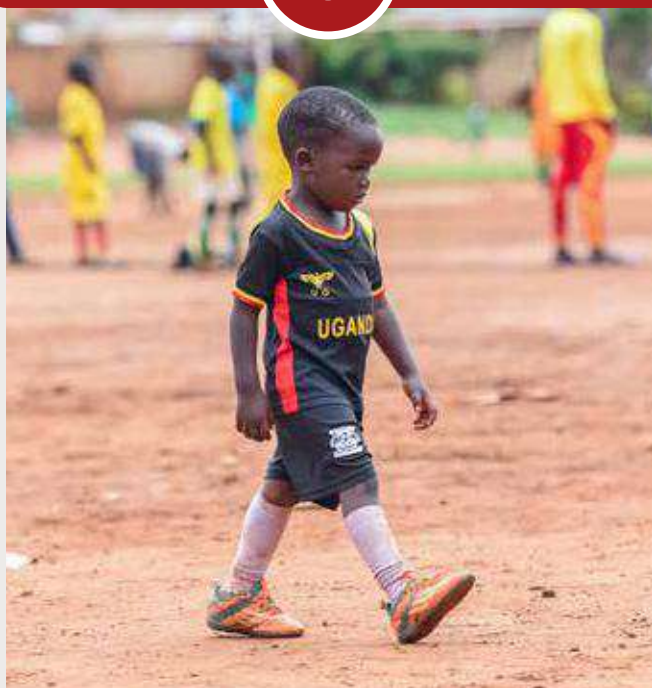
Most importantly, the league games also include workshops on Football 4 WASH drills, helping the kids to win not only on the pitch but also off it through vital health education.

Slums Derby



Arguably the biggest festival for slum kids in Uganda, the Slums Derby truly brings football home. Slum kids from all over Kampala and beyond can use that weekend in May to fight for the bragging rights in the slums.

The programme also includes workshops designed around Football 4 WASH games that helps the participants to engage in fun-filled learning.

We invite teachers and coaches from schools around the country to scout and present the kids with opportunities that range from scholarships, bursaries to placements.

We run all this in the middle of Kampala's biggest slums. Since 2013, and every other year, we take the festival to a new slum. We are coming to a slum near you.

Christmas Camp

With an average of 2,500 participants every year, the Christmas Camp is the biggest of its kind in East Africa, if not Africa.

Happening every year between 28th December and 4th January, the camp week is a one of its kind. We welcome teams, communities and kids from all over Uganda. To them we offer accommodation, food and water, plus football for a week. In addition, we organise workshops that range from Football 4 WASH to motivation and social skills workshops.

Every other year, we check out a new school/venue where we host Uganda's biggest camp, and we invite school teachers and coaches to the hub of football exhibition in the country.

In addition, we also organise a camp disco and a New Year's Eve celebration with a big feast that we only know how to.





What we do

Sparta 09 Teams

Our internal soccer teams of K.S. Sparta 09 are our pride and the most successful matchmaker for the future of our kids. We run a senior team, a junior team and an array of age group teams ranging from U-8s to U-17s, and a girls' team.

We aim, and have succeeded – in presenting our teams in several major tournaments and leagues to representatives of primary and secondary schools with the authority to offer sport scholarships.

By this, until today Watoto Wasoka has managed to facilitate access to education for more than 300 kids, offering them prospects that would otherwise have been forsaken for them.

Girls' football

We had always struggled with creating female football programmes. In 2016, we made exchange visits to Kenya to study successful girls' programmes at Mathare Youth Sports Association in Nariobi (MYSA) and Moving The Goalposts in Kilifi.

Since then, we have organised girls' editions running concurrently along all our other successful programmes, like the Girls' Slums Derby, Girls' Schools Championship, Girls' Christmas Camp.
