Founded in 2009, Watoto Wasoka is a youth-led football for development organisation in Uganda; we use football as a vehicle for social change in the lives of slum children in Uganda.

We seek to change lives, through structured football programmes, one game at a time. We do this by creating purposeful opportunities for play and learning, in a safe environment, for slum children in Uganda.

We also organise some of the biggest football events for youth in Uganda, East Africa (if not Africa), with our last Slums Derby attracting more than 1,500 kids, while the last Christmas Camp was attended by more than 2,700 boys and girls from all over Uganda.

In 2019, our work with slum kids in Uganda was recognised at the FIFA Diversity Awards 2019 in Milan, Italy.

In 2020, Watoto Wasoka revenue totalled EUR 39,670.
This was lower than the 2019 figure (EUR 58,113) due to the pandemic which halted many funds and grants


